On-line classroom accessed through WSD and affiliated learning platforms. Ensures instruction in core curriculum areas.	Parents responsible for obtaining resources and materials for the program of study.
As in a regular school year, students who are sick may request home learning packages. This year it also applies to students in quarantine.	To meet distancing requirements Grades 9-12 schools may choose to operate under the Blended Learning Model.	Temporary remote learning will only be offered by the division when it determines significant need across the system. The school will let parents know and parents can then choose to either opt for temporary remote learning during restricted level (orange) or continue to have their child attend in-school classes.	For students who have been diagnosed with a chronic medical condition are immuno-compromised and advised by a medical professional to avoid all public areas.	For students where parents choose to be responsible for their child's education and not have their child attend a public or independent school.
