A lot has changed since in class learning ended on December 22nd, this summary document will guide you to recent changes. It is current at the time of writing.

The best place to note significant changes is by reviewing our <u>current plan</u>. This document is updated as major changes occur. The <u>most recent Provincial document is here</u>.

The following changes will be in place on Monday, January 17th:

Manitoba Pandemic Response System

- On December 22nd schools were in <u>Yellow</u>.
- When students return on January 17th schools are in <u>Orange</u>.

Masks

- All staff are required wear approved medical masks. KN95 masks are listed as non-medical.
- Students are recommended to wear a well-fitting 3-ply mask. Medical masks will be provided to students at school who request them.

Contact Tracing

- The <u>new Notification Toolkit</u> is now online.
- Schools will not be required to identify or notify close contacts in school, and notification letters on individual cases will no longer be sent out by schools.
- Students and Staff that may have been exposed at school can continue to attend as long as they are asymptomatic.

Rapid Tests

- Rapid Test kits were distributed to K-6 students.
- Parents should test their children before returning to school on January 17th and periodically thereafter.
- Rapid antigen tests will be provided in staff as <u>announced by the Province on Tuesday</u>, <u>January</u> <u>11th</u> when they are received by the division.

Isolation Requirements

- <u>New isolation requirements</u> are in place.
- The rules are different for vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals.

Vaccine

- 1st, 2nd and booster shots are available at the Supersite in Morden
- Pharmacies and Menzies Medical Centre may be able to provide vaccinations.
- Clinics will be hosted for children ages 5-11 in schools. Parent consent is required for such a vaccination to take place.
