


OurSCHOOL Parent Survey, **Perspectives of Parents at Maple Leaf**

The OurSCHOOL Parent Survey is based on a comprehensive questionnaire covering several aspects of parents' perceptions of their children's experiences at home and school. It is based primarily on Joyce Epstein's framework for fostering positive relations between the school and the community. Successful schools foster greater communication with parents, encourage parental involvement in their child's schoolwork, and enlist parents to volunteer at the school and participate in school governance. The survey also provides feedback to schools about the extent to which parents feel the school supports learning and positive behaviour and promotes a safe and inclusive environment.

The survey includes seven separate measures which were scored on a ten-point scale. The scores for the Likert-format questions (i.e., strongly agree to strongly disagree) have been converted to a 10-point scale, then averaged and reported by question and by topic. A score of 0 indicates strong disagreement; 10 indicates strong agreement; 5 is a neutral position (neither agree nor disagree). The results for Maple Leaf are compared with those of MB Western School Division in the radar chart below. The remainder of this report provides a detailed description of the results.








Parent participation at Maple Leaf

Parents talked with a teacher



Parents attended meetings Maple Leaf




















Student bullying at Maple Leaf

The chart below indicates the types of bullying most often experienced by the students at Maple Leaf.







Parents who felt their child was excluded at Maple Leaf
