

EAL Remote Learning Activities

Week of April 27-May 1

Below you will find some **optional** activities for your child to do. These activities are meant to be done in English as much as possible. Activities posted will focus on speaking, listening, reading, and writing in English. These are not assigned grades, they are offered to encourage English communication during this time away from the school.

1. Find someone to play I Spy with. Start simple (“I spy with my little eye, something that is (insert colour)”) and make it more challenging as you go “I spy with my little eye, something that is (insert shape) or (insert texture—soft, hard, spiky, etc)”. You can also use a few words to describe your mystery item (“I spy with my little eye, something that is red, round, and hard”).
2. Many fairy tales, such as Cinderella or Hanzel and Gretel, are known around the world. Read a fairy tale in your first language. Then find the English version of the same fairy tale and read it, or listen to it on Sora or Epic, and talk about the similarities and differences. Share your favorites with me if you’d like.
3. Go on a letter-sound hunt. Pick 2 letters and see how many things you can find, in your home or yard, that begin with that letter. Try it again with 2 different letters. Which letters had the most objects? Did you find anything that began with a Q or an X?
