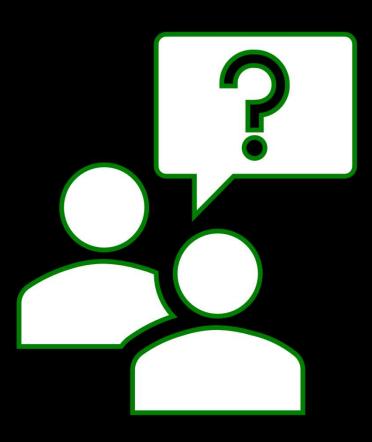
The Western School Division operates on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabe and Dakota peoples.

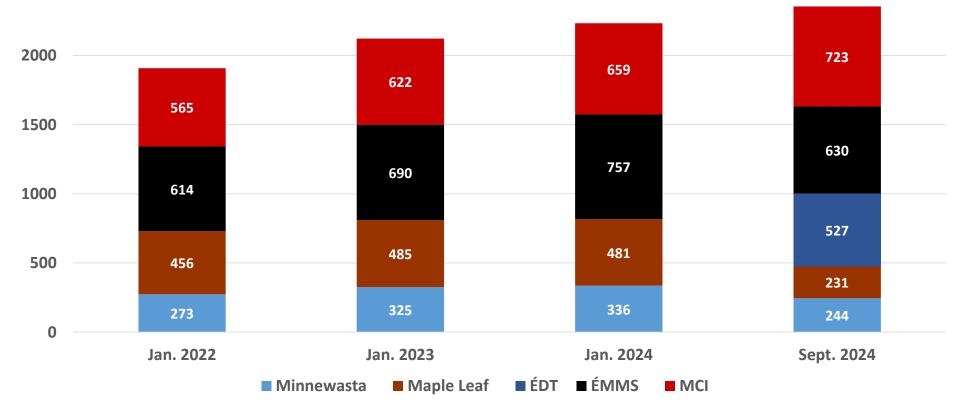






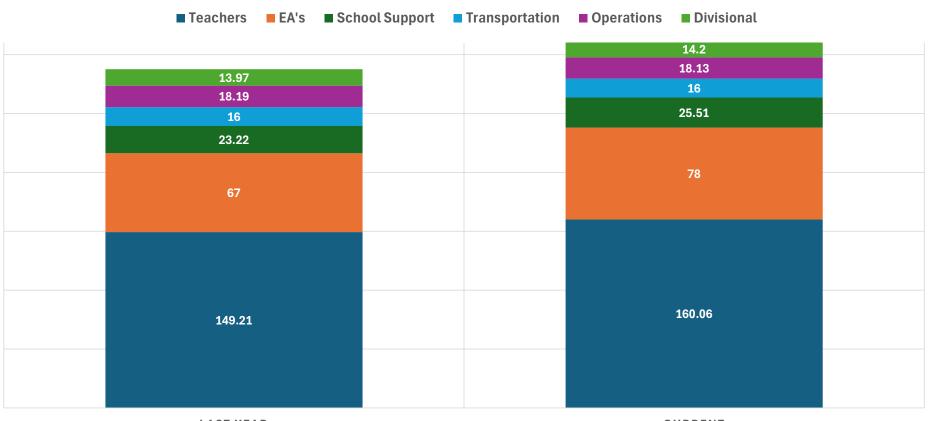


Enrollment





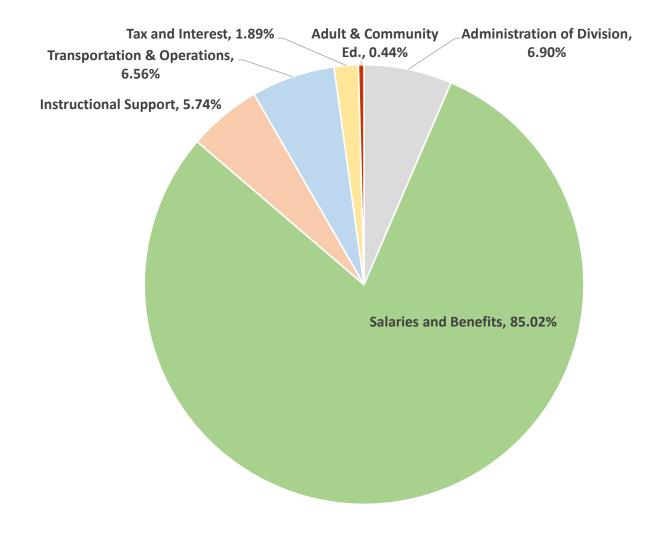
STAFF DISTRIBUTION

Forecasted Surplus/(Deficit) 2023-24 \$(\$81,427)

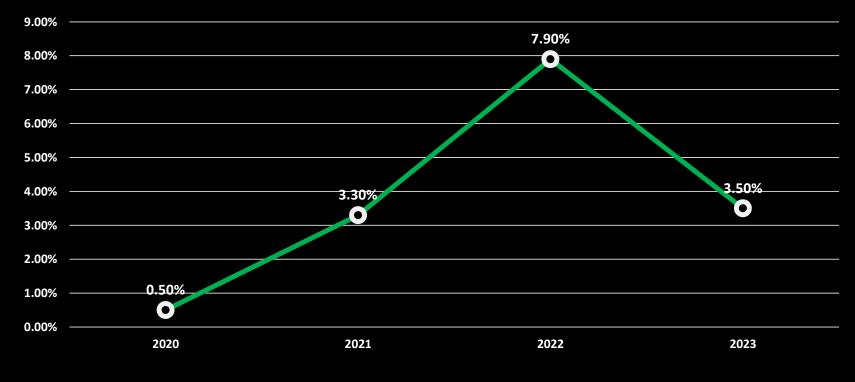
Forecasted Surplus/(Deficit) 2024-2025 \$115,144

Gross Accumulated Surplus as a % of 2024-25 Expenditures 2.91%

The Province restricts the reserve to a maximum of 4% of Operating Expenditures.

Total Funding for Outfitting is Under Review

- Government grants and funding for school start-up are under review
- Capital Reserve of \$500,000

Provincial Funding Estimate



- \$17,130,110 through the Funding of Schools Program
 - Operating Support (\$14,169,351) (\$26,408)
 - Additional (\$2,960,759) (\$804,000)
 - Nutrition Programming \$157,000
 - Special Needs \$195,731

 - Student Engagement & Presence \$149,000
 - Property Tax Off-Set Grant \$582,992
 - Support for Enrolment Growth \$148,000
 - Additional Operating Support \$1,204,000
 - \$499,000
- Estimated 5.1 % increase
 - \$830,408

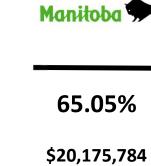


Funding Sources 2024-25

Proposed Expenditures



- Increased enrollment requires an additional 5.8 FTE teachers.
- Additionally, there is an increased allocation for Guidance and Resource. This adds an additional 5.6 FTE teachers.
- Increased Speech and Language and Occupational Therapy time.
- Funding to continue to support Behaviour Consultants and staff training.
- Increased Vice-Principal time at MCI for next year.
- Additional Support Staff for École Discovery Trails



Proposed Expenditures

(Continued)

- Wage and benefit adjustments for staff groups after a comprehensive review.
- Inflationary increases on fuel, utilities and insurance.
- Investments in Information Technology devices and infrastructure to support learning.
- Move Student Services Administrator position to full-time.
- Funding to support Board Priorities Initiatives.



Proposed Expenditures

(Continued)

- Additional costs for programming between ÉMMS and ÉDT.
- Equipment to develop a regulation space for students at Morden Collegiate.
- Support to replace and upgrade Band equipment at MCI.
- Pilot of new bus routing software for 1-2 buses.

- Non-Educator Staffing (\$425,000)
 - Custodial, IT, LRC, Clerical personnel
- Operating (\$300,000)
 - Utilities, Insurance, Maintenance & Supplies, Taxes, Snow Clearing etc.
