- 1. Call to Order & Introductions
 - The meeting was called to order at 7:03 PM by Chair, Jeri.
 - · Attendees introduced themselves. Welcome was extended to new parents.
- 2. Treasurer's Report (Cathy Dueck)

· Balance: \$520.77

· Recent Expense: \$17.91 for Hot Lunch folders.

- 3. Principal & Vice-Principal Report (Mr. Garth Shindle, Ms. Ashley Zylstra-Adamson, Mr. Jordan Pauls):
- · Playground Update: The new play structure is complete and popular. Safety rules are in place (max 6 kids at a time) due to its intense motion. Seatbelts have been removed by students and found discarded.
- · Future Playground Additions: A Gaga Ball pit (already budgeted for) and volleyball nets are planned for installation, potentially in the spring.

- · Arts Programming (Gr. 7/8): Due to lower enrolment, students choose between Band for the year or an Arts Rotation (Choir, Graphic Design, Visual Arts/Drama). Transportation to EDT for Band occurs every second cycle.
- · Athletic Fees: A new \$10 fee per sport team (max \$20/year per student) was announced to help offset rising costs, particularly for transportation. The school is exploring solutions like volunteer bus drivers.
- · Athletic Agreement: Students on sports teams must adhere to a code of conduct. The process for addressing behavioural issues is being standardized.
- · Universal Food Program: The program continues from last year, with snacks available in all classrooms. Funding is limited (~\$28,000/year), so the current model is being maintained.
- · School Safety: Two fire drills completed successfully. Two lockdown drills are scheduled for October and February.
 - · Upcoming Events:
 - · Orange Shirt Day: Friday, September 26.
- Terry Fox Run: Thursday, October 9. School goal is \$10,000. Incentive: Teachers will have a foot race in inflatable costumes if the goal is met.
- · No School: September 29 (PD Day) & September 30 (Truth and Reconciliation Day).
- · Yearbooks: Yearbooks from last year have arrived and will be distributed soon. Extra copies are available for \$22. Yearbooks are published annually for grades 5-8.
- · Grade 5 Lunch Monitors: Grade 8 students will act as lunch monitors in Grade 5 classrooms as a leadership opportunity. This will start next week.
- · School Handbook: The school website contains an updated handbook with the code of conduct and school plan. Parents are encouraged to review it.
- · Clubs & Activities: Numerous clubs are active, including Cross Country, Soccer, Noon Choir, QSA, Minecraft, MYRCA (Literacy), Drawing, Esports, and Jazz Choir. The Jazz Choir is planning a trip this year.

4. New Business

A. Hot Lunch Program (Led by PAC)

- · Purpose: To introduce Grade 5 students to the cafeteria experience. The food will be delivered to their classrooms initially, then transition to picking up from the cafeteria later in the year.
- · First Hot Lunch: Monday, October 6. Menu: Grilled Cheese, bag of chips, and a juice box. Price: \$7
- · Volunteers Needed: At least 5 volunteers are required each month. Volunteers are needed from 11:45 AM to 12:15 PM.
- · Action: A welcome letter explaining PAC and the volunteer need (including requirement for criminal record checks) will be sent home with the first hot lunch form.
- · Discussion: Potential for more "Cookie Days" this year. Hot lunch days may be moved from Mondays if other days work better for volunteers.

B. Fundraiser: Farm to School (October)

· Product: Vegetable bundles (Bundle A or B). Options to purchase a bundle for donation to Many Hands as well.

· Timeline:

- · Orders due: Tuesday, October 14.
- · Delivery: Wednesday, October 29. (To be confirmed)
- · Pick-up for parents: Wednesday, October 29, 4:00 PM 6:00 PM.
- · Volunteers Needed: For sorting bundles on delivery day and assisting with parent pick-up.
- · Action: Fundraiser information and online ordering details will be sent to parents. PAC tally order will need to be covered by credit card, PAC will need to reimburse.
- · Future Fundraisers: A Co-op gift card fundraiser in November was proposed as it was successful last year.

5. PAC Positions & Volunteer Support

- · The current PAC structure is small and informal. There is an openness to defining more roles to share the workload.
 - · Positions Needing Support:

- \cdot Social Media/Online Communications: To manage PAC updates on platforms like Instagram and Facebook.
 - · Hot Lunch Coordinator: To help organize the monthly program.
 - · General Volunteers: A group for ad-hoc tasks like counting fundraiser money.
- · Action: A group chat (e.g., WhatsApp) to be created for easier coordination among volunteers.
