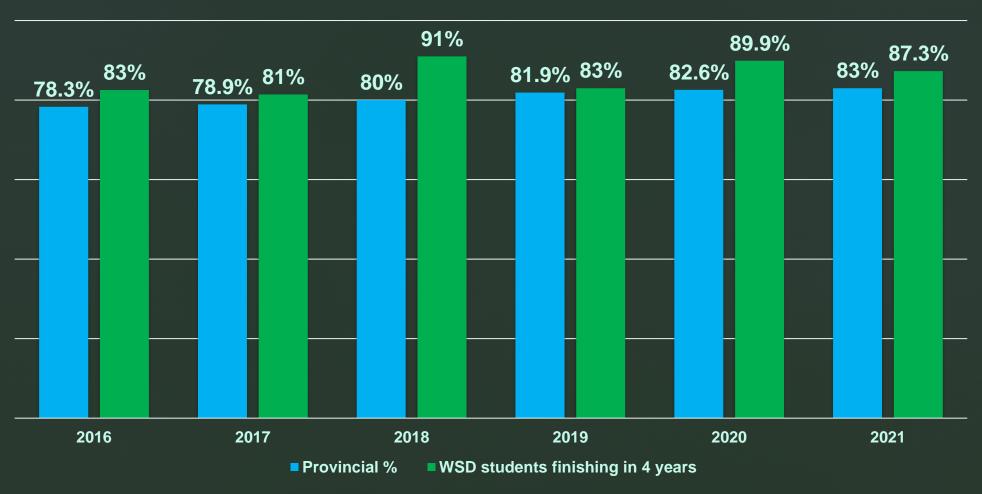

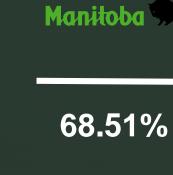

### Proposed Expenditures

- Increased enrollment requires an additional 5.625 FTE teachers.
- Additional Vice-Principal time at both ÉMMS and MCI for next year.
- A second Youth Support Guidance Worker to support students at ÉMMS and MCI.
- Additional funding for family counseling.
- A 0.5 FTE Library Clerk at Maple Leaf School.
- Support to encourage students to make healthy choices.







# Proposed Expenditures (Continued)

- Adding secondary (rear) bus arms to school buses to increase visibility and safety.
- Inflationary increases on fuel, utilities and insurance.
- Investments in Information Technology devices and infrastructure to support learning.
- A 0.5 FTE Student Services
   Administrator position.
- Reserve for Discovery Trails
   School, grounds development,
   and upgrading.
